Important information



The Big Story of the Bible

God – First, there was God.

Creation - The beginning of the universe which is regarded as an act of God

Fall - Describes how Adam and Eve went from innocent to guilty of disobedience

People of God - A description in both the Hebrew Bible and the Old Testament of Israelites. It is also sometimes applied to Christians.

Incarnation - The belief that Jesus (as part of the Trinity) was conceived in the womb of a woman called Mary

Gospel - The teaching or revelations of Jesus Christ and his disciples

Salvation - Refers to the soul being saved from sin and its consequences through Jesus' death and resurrection.

The Kingdom of God – life after death in a place called Heaven.

Old Testament – God, Creation, Fall and People of God

New Testament – Incarnation, Gospel, Salvation and the Kingdom of God

1	What part of the Easter Story is depicted in Year 5 and 6's hall board?	We will learn about our part in the hall board display in the Easter story. You will help prepare the display board.	
2	What evidence is there to suggest that Jesus was resurrected?	You will revise the Big Story of the Bible. In groups, you will look at evidence and 'witness statements' from Luke's Gospel. You will create a drama that shares your part of the narrative and you will explain the evidence you found.	
3	What are the five core Christian concepts that we have focused on in Lesson 2?	You will match the five core concepts to a theological definition. You will look at some art that shows the life of Jesus and write a gallery description of the piece of art, including how it matches to one or more of these concepts	
4	What are the connections between Christian belief in the Resurrection and they worship on Good Friday and Easter Sunday?	You will learn some ways that a range of Christian denominations' practices in church on Good Friday. You will reflect on how the mood changes over the course of those two key days in the Church's calendar.	
5	Can you list some ways in which faith in a resurrected, living Lord Jesus might comfort and inspire Christians?	You will listen to a range of Easter songs that can be sung on Good Friday and Easter Sunday. You will be able to identify the emotions associated with the songs and how these might affect Christians. You will consider whether these same songs can be used in Christians' everyday lives.	
6	What difference does the resurrection make to Christians?	Year 6 will briefly revisit the work they undertook on Salvation in Year 5 and share it with the class. After that, you will look at quotes from some significant individuals which will lead to a silent class debate about how believing in the resurrection of Jesus might make a difference to how people live today.
