By the end of this unit, you will be able to find and locate key countries, cities, continents and oceans on a map. You will be able compare our local area with areas in India.

Important information



The first part of this unit of work will focus on map work. You will begin by finding and locating the four countries in the United Kingdom (England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland) and their capital cities (London, Edinburgh, Cardiff and Belfast) on a map using an atlas. Then, you will learn to find the seven continents (Europe, Asia, Africa, North America, South America, Australia and Antarctica) and five oceans of the world (Atlantic, Pacific, Indian, Arctic and Southern) using a map. All the while, you will be keeping an eye on where we are and where India is in relation to these places.



For the second part of this unit of work, we will focus on comparing the human and physical similarities and differences between Cumbria and India. This will include, work, school, food, weather, wildlife and much more. You will use our new map skills to help you with this, as well as using tools for research.

1	Can you find the different countries in the UK and their capital cities?	You will learn how to use an atlas to find locations. You will be able to mark the countries of the UK and their capitals on a map. Where do we live on a UK map?	
2	Can you find the continents and oceans of the world on a map?	You will learn to use an atlas to locate the world's seven continents. You will use an atlas to find the world's five oceans. Where is India on a world map? Where is Britain?	
3	What are the human similarities and differences between Cumbria and India?	You will the difference between human and physical geography. You will learn about how different children and adults live in India and how this is the same or different to how we live. Would you rather live in Cumbria or India?	
4	What are the physical similarities and differences between Cumbria and India?	You will recap the difference between human and physical geography. You will compare the weather, landscape and wildlife in India to Cumbria.	
5	Can you research key human and physical facts about India?	Using your existing knowledge of India, you will work in small groups to use books and the internet to research interesting information about India. You will present this information on a poster.	
6	Can you present your research to the rest of the class?	You will present your posters to the rest of the class speaking confidently. You will ask other groups interesting questions about their work.
