You will be introduced to one of the most iconic artists of all time with this 'Warhol and the Pop Art Movement' unit of art. You will explore what constitutes art and why people's opinions on what art is differ, before delving into the Pop art movement, investigating a variety of works by Warhol and other Pop art artists.



Andy Warhol's birth name was Andrew Warhola

Born in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania in 1928

He worked in a number of media his most famous works were created using silkscreen and lithography
Andy Warhol had an interesting sense of style; he wore silver wigs and eventually dyed his hair silver.
After having been told he had lazy eyes, he wore opaque glasses that had a tiny pinhole for him to see through.

How can I create a self-portrait in the style of Andy Warhol?	5	You will study a Warhol self-portrait, then plan and create your own self-portraits inspired by Warhol. You may either use pencils, pens, paints etc., or computer software.	
To be able to use objects of popular culture to create Pop art.	What can I use in my own piece of pop art?	6	You will learn about the pop art movement, then create your own pop art pictures using a range of techniques, materials and found objects
