il fait chaud – it's hot

il fait froid – it's cold

il fait nuageux – it's cloudy

il fait du vent – it's windy

il fait du brouillard – it's foggy/ there is fog

il pleut – it's raining

il neige – it's snowing

il gèle – it's freezing/ it freezes

### Transport

avion – plane

autobus – bus

train - train

You will look at weather around the world and use your knowledge of numbers to help you. You will be able to choose the correct preposition, au or en, depending on whether it is a masculine or feminine country	
5	I can talk about going on holiday  Translate: I am going on holiday to France by plane with my mum and brother	You will use last week's knowledge of countries to help you with part of this and your knowledge of transport from this year while also learning about names in your family. You will use all of this in a sentence about your holiday
